Austin Sterling Tolle, age 22, of Rosemount, Minnesota passed away on Thursday, January 17, 2019 due to a car accident.

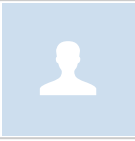

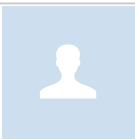

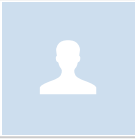
