Belinda Sue Petropoulos met her beloved Saviour face to face on Saturday, March 29, 2025.

Belinda was born March 4, 1956, in Birmingham, Alabama, to Benny Neal Reed and Ruby Catherine Reed. Belinda has four siblings – Deborah Michael, Cindy Brundage, David Portwood (wife Jan) and Cynthia Simpson (husband Bruce). Belinda's parents preceded her in death.

Belinda leaves behind her husband, Dave Petropoulos; stepchildren Jacob, Corie, and Matthew; other family and untold lives that have been influenced by her kindness and investment.

Belinda was a master teacher. She began her teaching career at Hammond Baptist Junior High School teaching English and physical education in 1979. After teaching at the junior high for fourteen years, Belinda moved to Hyles-Anderson College to become the Dean of Woman and to teach several classes, including English, education, and philosophy. She also used her musical talents to train many tour groups and musical ensembles. For twenty-nine years she worked at the college until her retirement in 2022.

Belinda has always been a special person. As a child, according to her sister, she did no wrong! She maintained that testimony throughout her life, striving

to please Jesus in all she did. D.L. Moody said “The world has yet to see what God can do with a man fully consecrated to Him.” Belinda fully consecrated her life to God and the impact she has made is worldwide. She has invested in generations of people who are continuing her legacy and mission to make a difference for the sake of the Gospel and for Jesus Christ.

The world is now a little darker with her bright light no longer shining. Her absence will be felt deeply by those left behind to miss her.

There will be a viewing for Belinda on Friday, April 4, from 3 pm to 6 pm at the Wendell Evans Auditorium at Hyles-Anderson College (8400 Burr Street, Crown Point, IN 46307). The funeral will be held on Saturday, April 5, at 10 am in the Wendell Evans Auditorium. There will be a private burial at Memory Lane Memorial Park.

Mrs. Belinda, held her head up high, she was poised, and she was confident. She walked with a purpose (meaning: her work got done) and she walked in her purpose. (meaning: she served her people) She served: the students and staff, the church ministries, assisted with Weddings, and Showers, Conferences, and College events etc....day and night, when needed.

As I recall, when I began to work with Mrs. Belinda, she impressed upon me the seriousness of her work. Everything had a time and a purpose, a place and reason. I'd like to say, she operated with perfection, everything was in its place. Mrs. Belinda, was adept at just about everything. She was a master of Business Administration. It was important to her that the business of the Dean of Woman's Office be run seamlessly, and it was.

Mrs. Belinda's work involved, office procedures, productivity, paperwork, management and orderliness. However, she had another aim, her roll as Dean of Women, as it pertains to personally serving people. And this in particular, meant much more to Mrs. Belinda.

Mrs. Belinda was about empowering others and building relationships. She was about caring for people, and loving them, in spite of any flaws. She was about going out of her way to comfort. She was about reinstating hope in others. She was about aiding people in need, and finding remedies to help people, during their

healing process, be it the body, soul or spirit. Mrs. Belinda was about building up people. After working with her for several years, I found Mrs. Belinda to be extraordinary in so many ways.

Mrs. Belinda, was also about helping people understand that their potential was bigger than their problems. More times than not, Mrs. Belinda was more concerned about the Humanity and dignity of people. She prayed with students, gave grief counseling and student counseling.

Mrs Belinda also made personal visits to dormitory rooms, or called students to her office, when a students needed extra physical, or emotional support.

Sometimes, she made hospital visits, and facilitated doctor's visits for students. If there were any concerns about a student's physical health and wellbeing, it was checked upon, nothing was insignificant to her. If there was a need, Mrs. Belinda found a way to fill that need, it was her purpose.

I loved watching Mrs. Belinda spend time with students. Her office was filled with laughter, teaching, giving advice about life, having a question and answer time, having discussions with groups of students, telling stories and listening to stories, giving words of encouragement, and sharing testimonies. She was so full of life and joy. Mrs. Belinda was loyal and committed to the students in the College, HB Schools, and especially the Bus Kids. They loved her, and she loved them. Mrs. Belinda was Beloved!!

I admired Mrs. Belinda, she was a role model for me, the staff ladies, and the ladies in the dorms, during the years, I was at the college. Mrs. Belinda taught us to be resilient, steadfast and resourceful. Mrs. Belinda taught us to use our authenticity and all that we've learned from her, to make a huge impactful difference in this world. I'm so appreciative of her dedication and hard, important work, all these many years.

I'm very grateful that Mrs. Belinda chose me, as one of her

Dormitory Supervisors. I was so honored. I learned a wealth of knowledge from Mrs. Belinda, she taught me the gifts of teaching, counseling, and care giving. I was honored to have been able to work alongside of her and Ms. Ryland, in Dean of Women's Office, it meant the world to me.

I'm grateful to have learned from Mrs. Belinda, her attributes, of compassion, commitment, courage, and "how to love people." As I look back and think, on my college studies, and career, I'm overwhelmed by the thousands of young ladies, who came through the dormitories of Hyles-Anderson College. I believe everyone could attest, that Mrs. Belinda gave her all each day, from the break of day to the midnight hours. She did everything with excellence. She never left things unfinished. Mrs. Belinda left a huge imprint on all of our hearts. Her presence will be remembered forever.

We were all very fortunate to have been influenced by Mrs. Belinda. I feel grateful, to have had the experience and presence of a dynamic leader. She taught me a plethora of life skills. "Who can find a virtuous woman for her price is far above Rubies" Proverbs 31:10

One day, Mrs. Belinda, contacted me and gave me the opportunity to sing with Mr. Robin Lion, and the Hyles-Anderson Choral group. I was asked to record a Christmas CD for the college. Mrs. Belinda was such a true blessing to me, and I'm grateful for her example and loving heart.
