March 4, 1942 - September 3, 2017

Joel L. Cortina, Sr., 75, of Crown Point, Indiana entered eternal life on Sunday, September 3, 2017 at 1:10 a.m. in the VNA Hospice Homecare, Chicagoland Christian Village, Crown Point, Indiana.

He was born as an only child to the late Victoria L. and Servando G. Cortina on March 4, 1942 in Weslaco, Texas. The family moved to Alsip, Illinois in 1954 and Joel attended school in Blue Island, Illinois. He was employed for 42 years in the railroad industry. Joel and Virginia were married July, 27, 1963 in Harvey, Illinois. He was a 30 year resident of Richton Park, Illinois and a member of Saint Lawrence O'Toole in Matteson, Illinois. In 2001, he moved to Crown Point, Indiana, Lake of the Four Seasons, and was a member of Holy Spirit Church.

Joel was a talented illustrator and a very creative individual. His skills as an awesome handyman, gardener and cook in the kitchen kept him busy. Action packed movies were his favorite genre, and with his child-like nature he was a great friend to many.

He is survived by his loving wife of 54 years, Virginia L. (nee Swick) Cortina; his children: Joel Cortina, Jr. of Scottsboro, Alabama, Victoria Ann (Terry) Jankowski of Valparaiso, Anthony Alan Cortina of Crown Point and Cynthia Lorraine (Larry) Bean of Crown Point. Those were great days before Joel and his family moved to Chicago. Once he moved to Chicago, he felt embarrassed to say I was his uncle because we were the same age, so told his friends I was his cousin.

I miss those days and I will always miss Joel. Rest In Peace Joel!

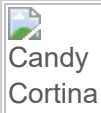

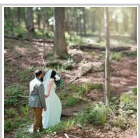

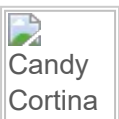
