



Otto Franz Gehrig

August 31, 1927 - September 5, 2019

Otto Franz Gehrig, 92, of Merrillville, Indiana, passed away on Thursday, September 5, 2019 with his loving family by his side. Otto was born in Berlin, Germany on August 31, 1927. During his teen years, he was mandated to join the German Army and served as a German soldier during WWII. He was later captured and spent a few years as a POW in France.

Otto came to America in April 1959, and his family came to America in the Fall of 1959.

He is survived by his children: Angelika Gehrig (Bob Cretney), Cordula Gehrig, and Lothar (Debbie) Gehrig; his grandchildren: Christina, Patricia, Deanna, Daniel, Gregory, and Eric; his great grandchildren: Max & Fletcher. He is also survived by his brothers: Rudolph and Gerhard Gehrig; and many nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his wife, Anita Gehrig in 1995; and his brothers: Lothar and Adolf Gehrig.
