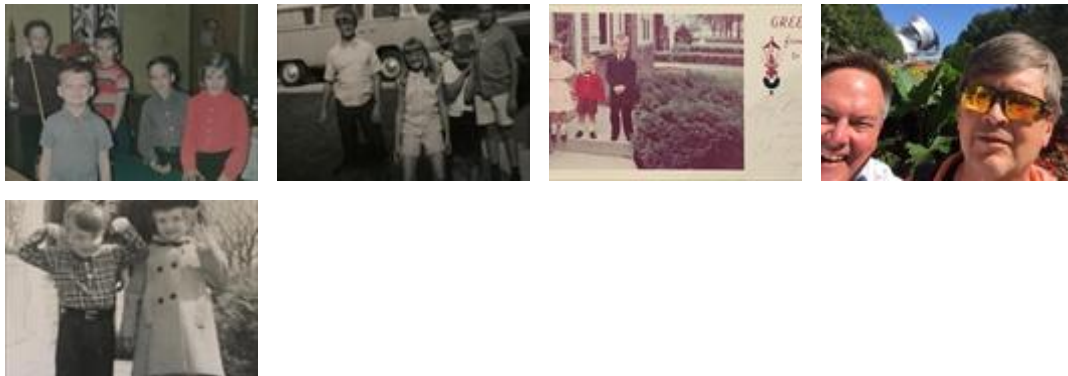

“ *Life is a hundred times too short. I was so saddened to learn that my cousin William Froberg had passed away in Florida. Bill — a supremely talented photographer — was a great guy. Our mothers were cousins; our fathers, friends since childhood. And my heart just breaks for Bill’s daughter, Heidi, Bill’s mother, my Aunt Marion, and Bill’s brother and sisters, Bobby, Bonnie and Cheryl. The years pass in the blink of an eye — a cliché, but it’s true. Here are a few snapshots from the last time Bill and I were together in Chicago plus some old family snapshots. (Cheryl wasn’t born yet when these were taken.)*

When I think of Bill, I think of his intelligence and humor. Of summers up north, in Michigan’s Upper Peninsula, as kids and grown men. Of laughing as children to Spike Jones and His City Slickers on the record player at Uncle Wiljo and Aunt Gladys’ home. Of shooting pool with Bill and Bob and my brother Joe at the Liberty Bell Tavern in Hurley. Of countless family dinners and get-togethers at the old Froberg home in Lombard. Of Bill’s great story about being on a job somewhere across the country, getting back to his hotel room that night, flipping on the TV, and seeing his Dad being interviewed on CNN. About the Unabomber. (Turns out the guy lived across the street from Uncle Roy in Lombard for a while. Bill telephoned his Dad, “Dad? What’s going on?”) The Unabomber had been arrested.

When I think of Bill, I also clearly recall the love and pride in which he always spoke of his daughter, Heidi. I recall Bill’s advice to me about the farm in Ironwood. And I now keep thinking of his amazing photography, especially of his beloved dogs and his evening shots along the Bay and Gulf Coast in Clearwater and elsewhere. I may never look at a sunset again without thinking of him.

We had last exchanged messages around the time of Elsa the storm. Bill was fine then, but suddenly, surprisingly gone a few days later, on a Saturday. You left us much, much too early and we all miss you, Bill.

Bill continued to get out and live his life despite his demanding job. Bill would usually speak his mind and would not try to act out a role – Bill’s authenticity, tempered by time, experience, and consideration, helped make the periodically mundane aspects of our jobs or lives less gloomy. But the attribute that struck me most deeply was Bill’s rock-solid core character. Despite the ups and down of life, and despite the periodic struggles we all have with relationships and with seeing things through other’s eyes, Bill’s core behavior, his goodness and faith, remained exemplary and inspirational to me. Bill certainly lives on in my life. And I am confident his spirit will endure. I look forward to sharing some laughs again with Bill when my time comes.
